Re: GRAMA request dated 1/17/08, Trolley Square

Dear Mr. Carlisle:

We received your GRAMA request dated January 17, 2008 for "all documents related to the shootings at Trolley Square mall and the suspect Sulejman Talovic". As you know, the comprehensive Trolley Square Shooting Incident Investigative Summary was made public last week on the SLCPD's website, www.slcpd.com. However, you have indicated that the information contained in the summary does not satisfy your GRAMA request.

Accordingly, the following requests are denied, with the citations to the provisions of the Utah State Code that exempts the records from disclosure:

- **witness statements** – U.C.A. § 63-2-304(9)(d), could disclose the identity of a source not generally known outside of government; and, U.C.A. § 63-2-302(2)(d), disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy.
- **recordings or transcripts of interviews** – U.C.A. § 63-2-201(3)(a), documents pertaining to the investigation of the incident are classified as protected; U.C.A. § 63-2-304(9)(e), could disclose investigative techniques not generally known outside of government; and, U.C.A. § 63-2-302(2)(d), disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy.
- **photographic or visual evidence** - U.C.A. § 63-2-201(3)(a), documents pertaining to the investigation of the incident are classified as protected; and, U.C.A. § 63-2-302(2)(d), disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy.

- **any statement or materials concerning Talovic's education and school background and his crimes as a juvenile** - U.C.A. § 63-2-201(3)(a), documents pertaining to the investigation of the incident are classified as protected; and, U.C.A. § 63-2-302(2)(d), disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy. The SLCPD does not document education and school background information unless provided by a witness, and the Juvenile Court would be the proper agency to contact regarding Mr. Talovic's juvenile criminal history.

If you are dissatisfied with our responses to your requests you may appeal the City's decision to the City's Records Appeals Board by filing a written notice with the City Recorder within 30 calendar days after the date of this letter, pursuant to City Code § 2.64.140. The address of the City Recorder is P.O. Box 145515, 451 South State Street, Room 415, Salt Lake City, Utah 84114-5515.
